This year is the 300th anniversary of the birth of Lancelot 'Capability' Brown, the father of English landscape gardening.

As part of the nation-wide Capability Brown Festival, the Berkshire Gardens Trust has arranged with the BBC for Caversham Park to be open on the afternoons of **Sunday 17th April, Sunday 12th June and Sunday 18th September** from 2pm to 6pm. Admission will be by ticket, which must be obtained in advance.

There will be a talk on the work that Brown did at Caversham Park, conducted walks in the grounds, a tour of the house and light refreshments.
